



The Toronto Health Economics and Technology Assessment Collaborative (THETA), funded by the Ministry of Health and Long Term Care, is conducting a research study to investigate the effectiveness and cost-effectiveness of specialized multidisciplinary wound care teams (MDWCTs) for community based patients with chronic wounds across Ontario. MDWCTs are defined as **teams having a minimum of 2 members with advanced training in wound management, representing a minimum of 2 different clinical disciplines (e.g., dietician, physiotherapist, occupational therapist, chiropodist, orthotist, physician, nurse, social worker), who share responsibility for the community-based patient with a chronic wound.**

This study consists of 3 phases: Phase 1-identification of teams; Phase 2-survey of teams; Phase 3-a pragmatic trial.
